## THE PROBLEM

Across urban and rural communities, textile waste continues to pose a major environmental challenge. In Canada alone, over **500,000 tonnes** of textiles end up in landfills every year, despite many of these materials being reusable or recyclable.

At the same time, employment barriers persist for newcomers and individuals facing systemic barriers to employment.

These two issues—waste and unemployment —may seem unrelated, but they share a common need: sustainable, community-based solutions that offer l**ong-term impact**.

is a social enterprise that transforms textile waste into opportunity.


## **HOW IT WORKS**



By collecting discarded clothing and fabric from local donation bins, community partners, and retailers, we divert waste from landfills and give it a second life through upcycled products.

These items are then sold in our storefront and online, generating revenue to sustain our mission.





We provide paid, hands-on employment and skills development for newcomers and individuals who have experienced long-term unemployment.

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Participants gain experience in areas like sewing, product design, customer service, and business operations, setting them up for long-term success in the workforce.
