THE PROBLEM



In our community, the lack of access and affordability to veterinary care prevents basic needs of cats and dogs from being addressed. Many owners lack crucial knowledge regarding hygiene and nail care for their pets.



640,000 bananas are wasted in Canada **every day**. Grocery stores are a major contributor to this, because no one wants to purchase a spotted or squishy banana. Meanwhile nearly 1.4 million Canadian children live in food-insecure households, meaning they don't have consistent access to enough nutritious food.

OUR SOLUTION

ProjectBANANA

is a social enterprise that transforms ripened bananas into banana chips and free snacks for Canadian youth.



is a small business that increases quality care for senior dogs and cats, and educates pet owners on animal health and wellness.

HOW IT WORKS



ProjectBANANA

We collect Bananas that have not been sold at local grocery stores and are going to be thrown out. Then we transform them into banana chips to sell in local stores and markets!

We also connect with local breakfast and snack programs to provide our banana chips for free to youth in their schools, providing a healthy (and tasty) snack.



Naile dIt

We provide paid, hands-on employment and skill development opportunities for students with animal experience. We train them to do nail trims and sanitary clips for senior pets.

We train students to provide clips and nail trims for senior animals at a reduced rate to owners. We also provide free and donation-based community sessions run by veterinarians to increase quality of care to senior pets.

OUR IMPACT

ProjectBANANA



Project Goal: Create banana chips from ripened bananas sell them while providing nutritious snacks to school-aged children.

What tools or methods were used? (e.g., surveys, receipts, partner verification)

- Attendance records measured number of students feed directly from our snack-program. Surveys at Farmer's Markets to analyze customer satisfaction.

What time period or sample was considered?

- 5 classes gave feedback and metrics after a 1-week period via Google Form

What assumptions or estimations were involved, if any?

- Assumed each student took no more than 2 packages of banana chips.

NailedIt

Project Goal: Provide nail trims and sanitary trims for senior cats and dogs

What tools or methods were used? (e.g., surveys, receipts, partner verification)

- Number of customers directly served, number of feedback surveys collected.

What time period or sample was considered?

- Feedback collected from cat and dog care education class using survey sent out 1-month after events

What assumptions or estimations were involved, if any?

- Every individual who attended our workshop cares for 1+ cats and/or dogs.
